Passage

World Health Organisation says that childhood obesity is associated with a higher chance of obesity, premature death and disability in adulthood. In addition to increased future risks, obese children experience breathing difficulties, increased risk of fractures, hypertension, early markers of cardiovascular disease, insulin resistance and psychological effects. A study conducted on 41 overweight children under confinement throughout March and April last year in Verona, Italy showed the lockdown restrictions negatively impacted their diet, sleep and physical activity. Compared with behaviours recorded a year earlier, they ate an additional meal per day, slept an extra half hour, added nearly five hours daily in front of the phone, computer and television screens and dramatically increased their consumption of red meat, sugary drinks and junk food. Physical activity, on the other hand, decreased by over two hours per week. "School environment provides structure and routine around mealtimes, physical activity and sleep—the three predominant lifestyle factors implicated in obesity risk," Myles Faith, a childhood obesity expert and co-author of the study was quoted in a report published in Science Daily
