So.....that(for both positive and negative meaning)

Too.....to+v1 (for negative comparison)

My grandfather is ^{so} too weak that he can not climb the stairs alone.

My grandfather is ^{too} so weak to climb the stairs alone.

Such.....as (जो, जिसको, जिसने /categorizing/relative pronoun)

Such.....that (कि /Strengthen/simple conjunction)

Rel Pron (Pron + Conj) ← as → जो
