

1. Weary :- Feeling or showing extreme tiredness

Mnemonics:- jaise cheeze worn out hoti hai insaan
weary ho jata hai

2. Ominous :- Giving the worrying impression that something bad is going to happen

Mnemonics:- ominous feel ho to bolo om namah shivay

3. Graft :- A piece of a living tissue or plant that is transplanted surgically

Mnemonics:- grafting se plant shi grow karte hai

Eg:- Gardeners are certainly coming to realise the benefits of grafted plants.

4. Rectify:- Adjust or make right; correct, amend

Mnemonics:- re + correctify

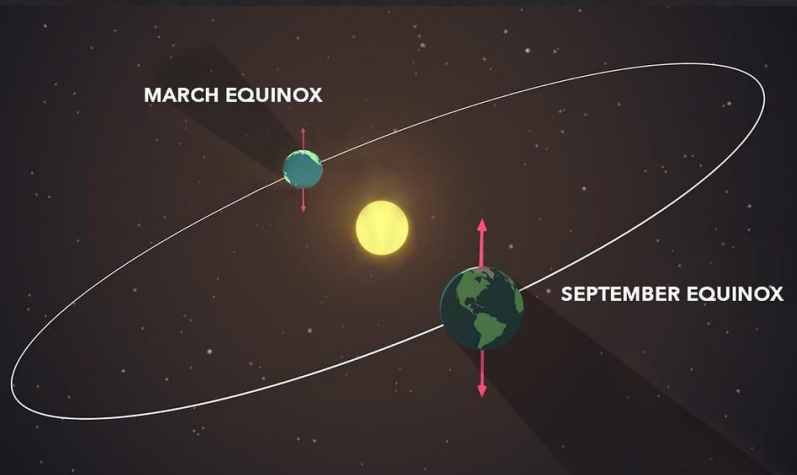


Eg:- I did my best to rectify the situation, but the damage was already done.

5. Equinox :- equal day and night / either of the two occasions in the year when the centre of the sun is directly above the Equator, and day and night are approximately equal in length

Eg:- The highest spring tides of the year occur after the equinoxes in March and September.

6. Flora :- the plants of a particular region **Mnemonics-** flowers

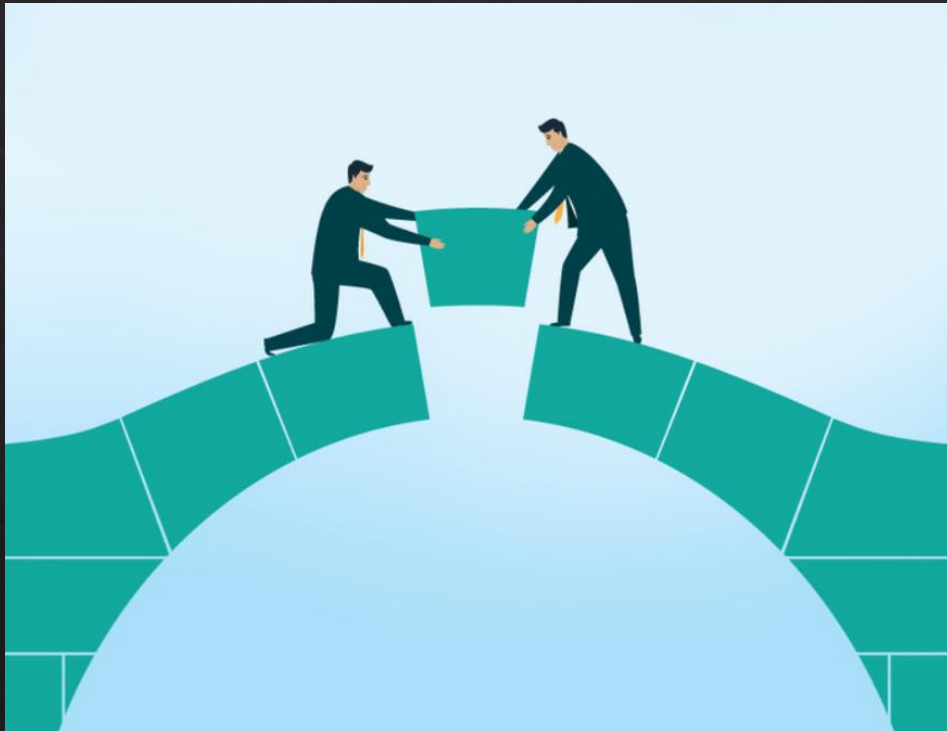
Eg:- Flora in the Amazon region includes over 7000 types of plants.

7. Abridgement :- A shortened version of a larger work

Mnemonics:- bridge se rasta short

Eg:- An abridgement of the book has been published for young readers.

8. Invigilator :- a person whose job is to watch people taking an exam in order to check that they do not cheat

Mnemonics:- vigilance/ lense lga ke nigrani karne wala Aman Sir English

Eg:- The invigilator can not give any explanation to the content of the exam questions unless it is printed illegibly.



9. **Clamour** :- A loud appeal or demand **Mnemonics-** kalah/ kalesh + more

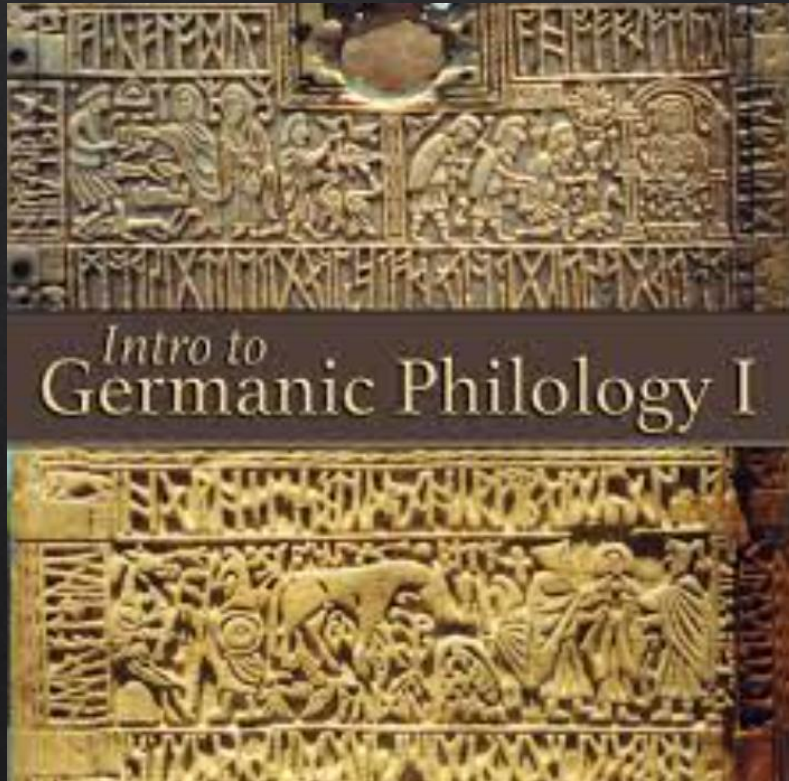
Eg:- The station was filled with the clamour of shouting voices and movement.

10. Philology :- The study of languages

Root word :- phil + logy

11. **Acerbic** :- Sharp and direct

Root word:- acer

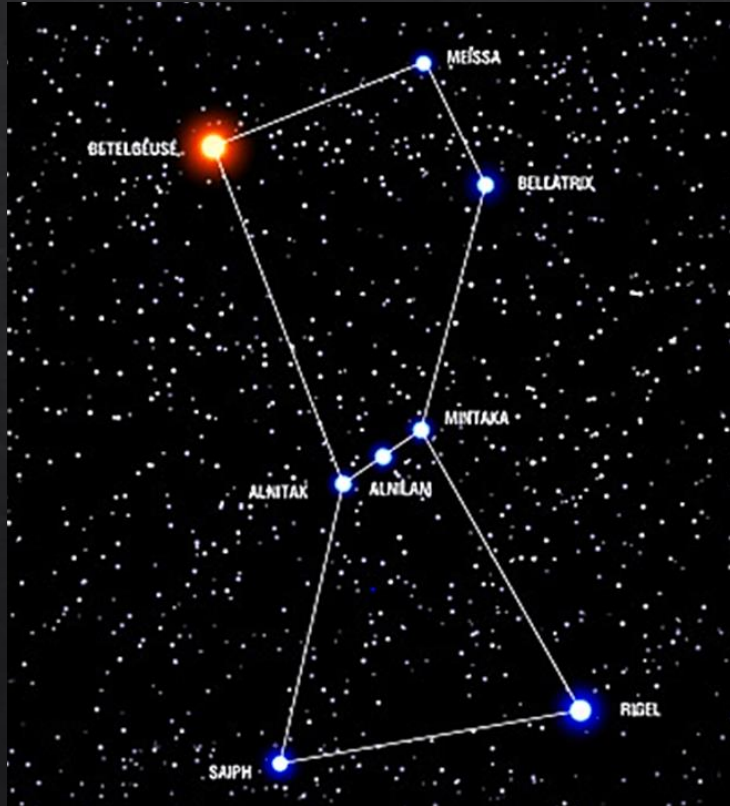


Eg:- Your remark was so acerbic that I can't forget or forgive it.

12. Constellation :- Series of stars

Mnemonics:- collection of stars

Eg:- The Little Bear constellation is still used by navigators at sea.

13. Amateur :- a person who takes part in an activity for pleasure, not as a job

Mnemonics:- amateur se aam taur se jada din koi activity nhi karte

Eg:- She is considered an amateur makeup artist so she doesn't get paid.

14. Negotiator :- One who mediates in a deal or complex situation

Eg:- The best negotiator makes both sides feel like winners.

15. Mausoleum :- A very expensive and elaborately built tomb

Mnemonics:- muslim ruler ne banwaya mausoleum

16. Nostalgia:- An excessively intense desire for returning to past or lost conditions

Mnemonics:- hostel me jo time jiya uska yaad karke

17. **Matricide** :- The act of killing one's mother

Root word - matr(mother) + cide (killing)

Eg:- As a punishment for matricide , he was sent to jail for 20 years.

18. Ablutions :- The act of washing oneself
Mnemonics:- holy solution se kiya ablution

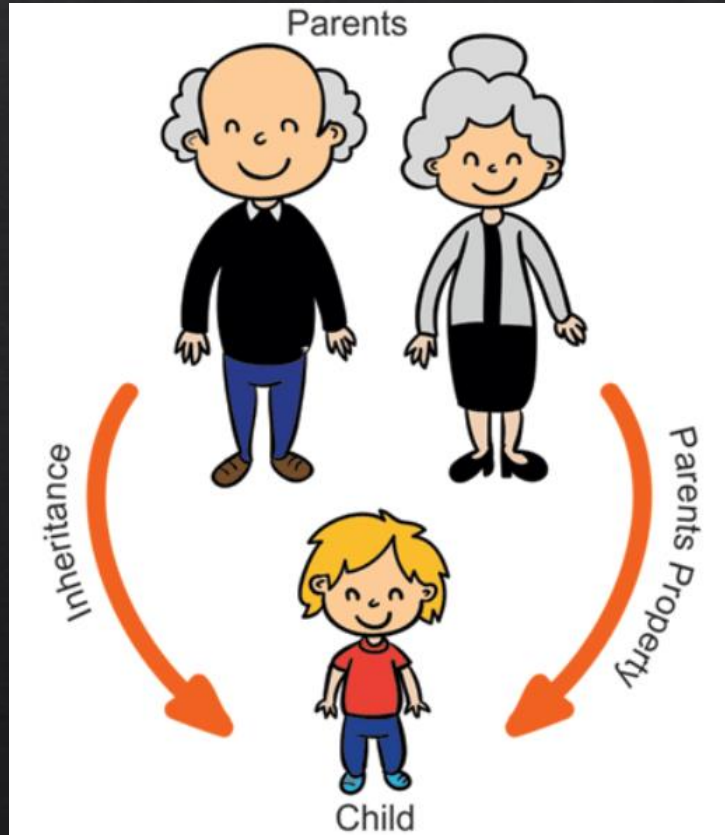
19. Legacy :- the long-lasting impact of particular events, actions, etc. that took place in the past, or of a person's life.

Mnemonics :- purane logon se milti hai legacy



Eg:- Though his family history was full of violence, he was determined to make his own legacy.

20. Legacy :- an amount of money or property left to someone in a will.

24. Aborigines :- a person, animal, or plant that has been
in a country or region from earliest times

Mnemonics:- original nivasi

25. Tenacious:- Holding on to something or keeping an opinion with determination

Mnemonics:- tennis elbow injury ke bawjood khelne ke liye tenacious

26. Absolution :- Formal forgiveness of a person's sins

Mnemonics:- 100 saal se sja kaat rha hai ab
absolution de do

Eg:- The priest would hear confessions and give absolution for sins."

27. Hyperbole :- An exaggerated statement not to be taken seriously or literally

Mnemonics:- hyper (more - badha chadha ke) + bole

Eg:- It was not hyperbole to call it the worst storm in twenty years.

28. Overlook :- Fail to notice; ignore; condone
(an offence etc.)

Mnemonics:- over (upar se / bypass) + look

Eg:- She was generous enough
to overlook my little mistake.

29. Mortuary :- A room where dead bodies are kept until burial

Mnemonics :- murdaghar

Eg:- Bodies left at the mortuary were eventually placed in unmarked graves outside of the funeral home.

30. Defamation :- The action of damaging the good reputation of someone

Mnemonics:- de + fame

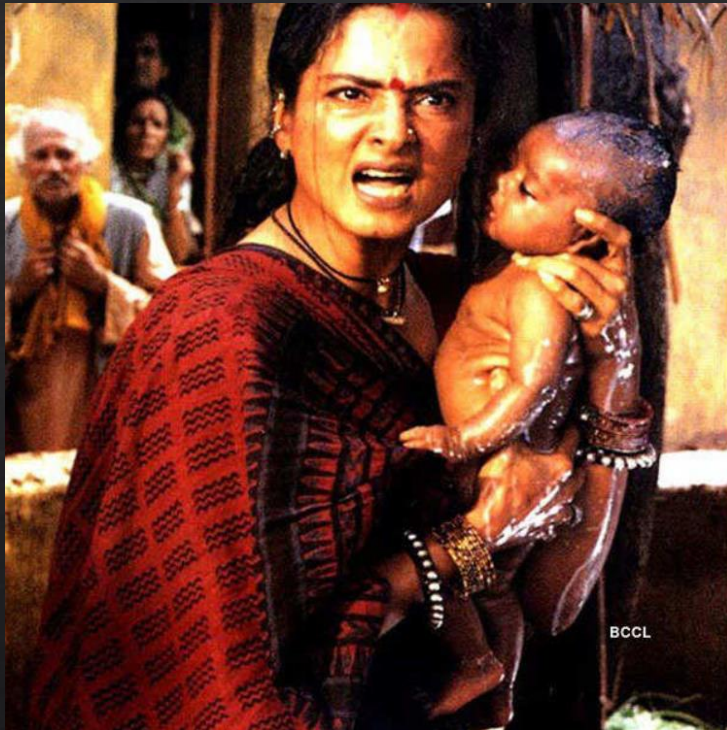


Eg:- During the match, the animosity between the two wrestlers was obvious.

Root word :- infant + cide

or causing much bloodshed

Mnemonics:- nar sanghar

34. Credible :- Able to be believed or trusted

Root word :- cred (belief)

35. FUGITIVE :- Someone who flees from prison and custody someone who is sought by law officer

Mnemonics- faujion ko tv pe dikhai gyi fugitive ki photo Aman Sir English



Eg:- Because the fugitive doesn't want to be seen, he rarely leaves his secluded cabin.

36. Alliteration :- Words that begin with the same letter, syllable or sound

Mnemonics- all + iteration(repetition)

uses alliteration.

37. Remorse :- Having a feeling of guilt

Mnemonics:- re marne ke baad remorse to hua hoga

and tradition

Mnemonics :- icon + blast

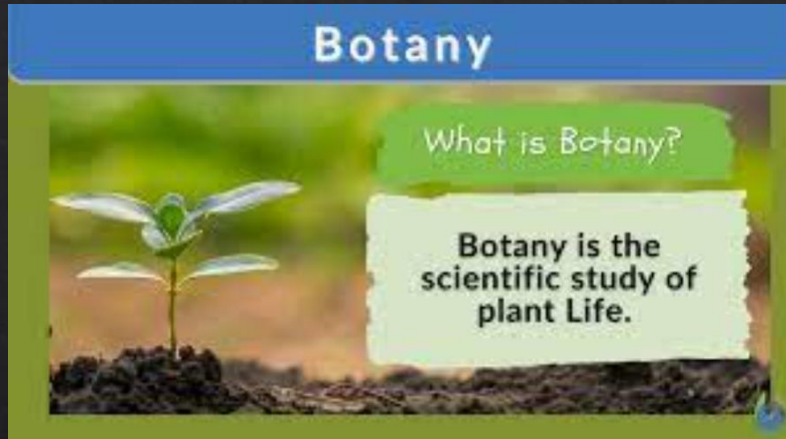
Eg:- It's perfectly feasible to produce electricity without creating pollution.

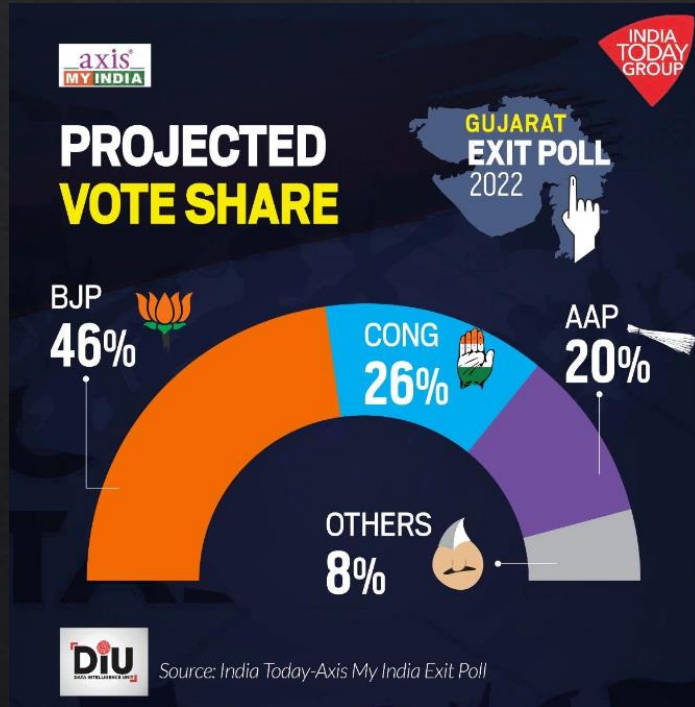
Eg:- A walk in the woods with his son became a lesson in botany.

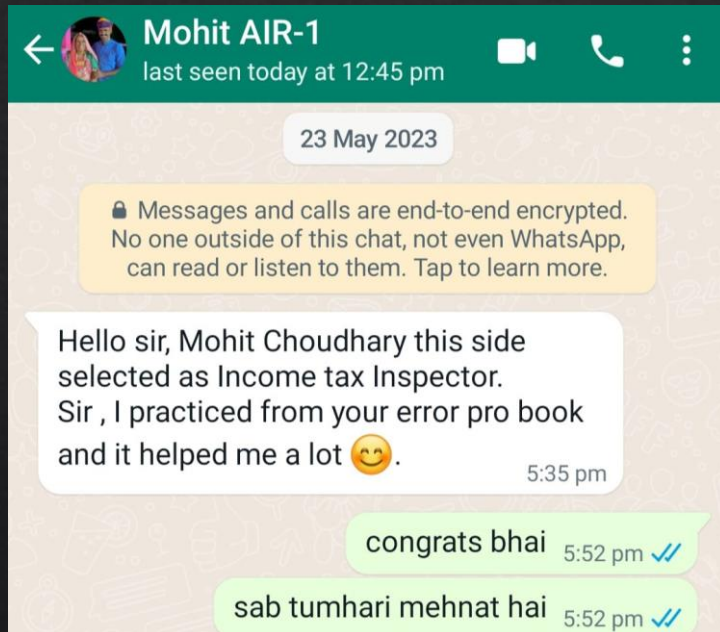
Eg:- Exit polls suggest a big BJP majority, but the true picture will only be known after the count.
